Introduction

The publication here presented is dedicated to music as a whole. The work was conceived in order to create or recreate a repertoire suitably adapted to satisfying the requirements set at junior high school for those specialising in music and not only, or rather, to use music as a whole as a preferential methodological instrument as well as a promotional tool for musical recreation and the consequential group interaction.

The pieces were chosen, always bearing in mind as the primary objective, the cultural conclusion on the one hand, and an improvement from the previous musical level on the other.

Another important factor taken into consideration when choosing the pieces was how appealing they would be to the children. This doesn't mean that the didactic objective was in any way undermined in order to satisfy the children's "musical tastes". More often than not, it was noted that the proposed pieces were appreciated right from the beginning of their study and preparation. This was both comforting and encouraging and confirmed the importance of the work that was being done with regards to both the choice and the arrangement of the proposals according to various different needs.

On various occasions, this musical product involved the collaboration of teachers from other subject areas: from the English language teacher who dealt with the foreign texts to the colleagues specialised in literature and musical studies who helped with the completion of the historical and musical aspects when compiling the repertoire.

All of these factors contributed to the creation of what must be its primary objective, that is the possibility to give each student an identity, respecting their individuality, trying, time by time, to individualise each one's peculiarities and musical inclination. The level of difficulty must be accorded to the different needs improving the instrumental, cultural, educative and creative abilities of the children.

The four pieces presented here are illustrative and represent some of the most famous pieces of Verdi's production.

La pubblicazione che qui presentiamo è dedicata alla musica d'insieme. Il lavoro è concepito al fine di creare o ricreare un repertorio adatto a realizzare gli obiettivi che la scuola media ad indirizzo musicale, e non solo, si prefiggono, ossia la musica d'insieme come strumento metodologico privilegiato nonché promozione della dimensione ludico musicale e la conseguente interazione di gruppo.

I criteri con cui questi brani sono stati scelti hanno sempre tenuto presente, come primo obiettivo, la finalità culturale da una parte e dall'altra il raggiungimento di un miglioramento del livello musicale precedentemente acquisito.

L'apprezzamento dei brani proposti da parte dei ragazzi è un altro elemento alla base delle nostre scelte. Questo non significa mai venire meno a quello che devono essere le finalità didattiche e culturali per incontrare i "gusti musicali" dei ragazzi. Il più delle volte si è verificato che la nostra proposta, sia stata apprezzata fin dagli inizi dello studio e della preparazione. Questo, ci ha confortato facendoci avere sempre maggior fiducia nel lavoro che stavamo svolgendo e nel modo in cui i brani erano proposti ossia adattati e arrangiati secondo le diverse esigenze.

In diversi casi il nostro *prodotto musicale* ha visto la collaborazione degli insegnanti delle altre discipline: dall'insegnante di lingua inglese per la cura dei testi stranieri, a quelli dell'area letteraria ai colleghi di educazione musicale per le scelte del repertorio, per il completamento della parte storica e musicale.

Tutto questo ha contribuito al raggiungimento di quello che deve essere l'obiettivo principale e cioè quello di dare un'identità ad ogni allievo, nel rispetto delle diversità cercando di volta in volta di individuare le peculiarità di ciascuno, le inclinazioni musicali adeguando il livello di difficoltà alle diverse esigenze per la valorizzazione strumentale, culturale, educativa e creativa dei ragazzi.

I quattro brani qui presentati rappresentano alcune delle più celebri pagine della produzione operistica verdiana.
